Carlos “Pepito” Estigarribia is a 3 times Australian Bboy champion and he represented Australia at the UK Bboy championship world finals in 2007.

Pepito has competed, performed and taught dance in the Unites States, Switzerland, Japan, New Zealand, Germany, Austria, Greece, United Kingdom, Singapore, and now Tambellup!
