Handcrafted creatures, delicate embroidery and stunning prints made by the Northam Yorgas craft group will be part of the 2017 Revealed Aboriginal art market in Fremantle which brings together Aboriginal artists from across WA.

It will be the first time this group of Ballardong artists from Northam has been invited to join this popular annual event.

The Revealed Aboriginal art market gives emerging artists an opportunity to sell direct to the public and retain 100 per cent of the profits.

Yorga members said they were excited to be attending the markets for the first time.

Their textile designs and woven work were inspired by creatures and nature from the Wheatbelt and from their own stories.

The artists said it was a big deal...like the saying 'from little things big things grow'.
